## Committee Seeks Seed Money for GHS Renovation

At a July 25 special workshop meeting, the School Committee voted (4-0, Wright and Phillips absent) to request \$300,000 in seed money from the Town Council to proceed with planning for the expansion and renovation of the existing high school. The funds would be used to hire professional engineering and architectural services.

Although Superintendent Heather Perry had hoped to bring the request before the Council in August, she said after meeting with Town Manager David Cole on July 28, "the likelihood is now that this request will not go to the Town Council until September at the earliest." In mid-August, School Committee chair Darryl Wright and Town Council chair Michael Phinney will meet with Perry and Cole "to discuss and map out a timeline."

At a joint workshop with the Town Council on June 27, a consulting firm presented the results of a feasibility study that included three options. The least expensive option, renovation and expansion of the existing facility with an estimated cost of \$50 million, received positive comments from council members. However, they expressed some concern over the cost and did not take a formal vote. After discussion about whether or not the Town Council had endorsed moving in this direction, the School Committee voted to request the seed money.

In addition to concerns about the cost of renovating the high school, Town Council chair Mike Phinney has raised questions about the need for expansion based on enrollment predictions. In 1994, the high school, which was built in 1959, was renovated to accommodate 750 students. Phinney noted that early in this century the facility had as many as 900 students, which is close to the 955 number projected over the next decade. Gorham, however, is one of the fastest growing towns in Maine with acres of undeveloped land and school enrollment projections are at best uncertain.

A quick ride through Gorham will confirm that summer has brought about many changes in town. The Lady Stripper held its grand opening on July 20 in the space previously occupied by the Gorham Grind.

Site work has begun on the future home of Station Square, a commercial and residential property at 17 Railroad Ave that will house 33 apartments, a bowling alley, a restaurant and two small retail sites.

Great Falls Construction has been renovating the exterior of 81 Main Street, which houses Village Hair. The renovated building, owned by Jon and Cindy Smith, will feature five new dormers, shutters and decorative window surrounds. The main entrance will be modified to include more windows.


Across the street, Citgo/Big Apple is temporarily closed in July for the replacement of underground tanks. The business is targeted to reopen during the week of August 20.

Grit & Grace CrossFit has signed an agreement to lease the building where

iSpoon was located. The opening is scheduled for September.

Further down Main Street on route 25, construction of the Sebago Brewery is underway and expected to be complete by the end of 2017, with beer available in the taproom beginning in January 2018. There will also be an outdoor patio and green space for seasonal use.

Also on Lower Main Street, TNT Quickstop reopened at the end of July and will hold a grand opening celebration from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. on August 24.

Work Continues Toward a Sensible Solar Policy

Last week, after months of work toward a bipartisan compromise that would have put affordable solar power within reach for more Maine people and businesses, politics won the day. In a vote of 88 to 48, just three votes short, the House was unable to override the governor's veto of LD 1504, An Act Regarding Solar Power for Farms and Businesses.

Right now, people who have made the investment in solar power have had to shoulder the entire cost of making the switch, except for a small benefit known as "net-metering." Net-metering eases the cost burden for solar customers by counting the energy they contribute back to the grid when they pay for any electricity they use when the sun isn't out. It makes sense and it's only fair. Unfortunately, the Public Utilities Commission decided to eliminate net-metering in their latest round of rule making.

This year's compromise bill would have prohibited the PUC from going forward with its replacement to net-metering, called "gross metering."

Instead, it would allow all owners of rooftop solar to continue with net-metering for 15 years, provided they have applied by December 31 of this year. For those applying in 2018, net-metering would continue but with a 10% reduction in the credit for the transmission and distribution portion of the ratepayer's bill. For 2019, this reduction would be 20%.

The bill also would have lifted a cap on the number of meters in a community solar project that would have allowed more people to collectively invest in solar.

Maine people are struggling to keep up with high energy costs. We should be focused on increasing access to sustainable sources of energy. Once the up-front costs are out of the way, solar panels can save Mainers thousands of dollars a year in energy costs. Just think what that could do for Maine's economy if more Maine families could afford to install solar systems.

Solar power is an essential element to a responsible energy policy for Maine. It's past time to make that idea a reality. Maine is lagging behind in New England and much of the rest of

the country in solar energy capacity.

Vermont is already able to power 35,000 homes with the 196 MW of solar power they harness. In Massachusetts, the contrast is even more stark at 1,592 MW. If you look at a map of solar plants in New England, you can barely see Massachusetts for all of the yellow suns marking the locations of the plants.

Why is it then, with virtually the same climate, Maine generates only 11% of Vermont's total and even worse, a mere 1% of Massachusetts' output?

While I'm certainly disappointed with the failure of LD 1504, I'm still committed to working toward a sensible solar policy for Maine that puts us on an even footing with our neighbors and invests in a bright future for our state.

Both Jessi Dobbins and Amber Wilson came to yoga when life felt overwhelming, and they couldn't believe the transformative effect that it had on their lives. According to Wilson, "We started out by going to a weekly class together, and have never looked back. We have taught at studios, gyms, and ran 6-week sessions at various locations. We often called ourselves the traveling yogis."

Their dream to have their own studio was realized with the opening of Gorham Yoga Company in May of this year. "When faced with the decision if we should chase after our dream or play it safe, we decided to take the risk. # Three Months in Haiti

"I liked new food, new music, new schedule and rhythms, new sounds, new smells, new things to laugh about...(but) it is the people I think about most," Chip Cain wrote to his friends back in Haiti after returning to Gorham from the desperately poor Caribbean country. As part of his continuing involvement, Cain is soliciting used cell phones so that people can communicate with the medical clinic in Ti Riviere where he worked this past winter.

Cain, a retired Portland school social worker, moved to Gorham with his wife Cecilia about two years ago. Last year, he read a newspaper article about Coley Gorham, of Portland, who had spent 20 years building houses and a free school on the north coast of Haiti. The 98-year-old Maine philanthropist wanted to make a return visit to find a partner organization that would help run and fund the failing St. Peter's Youth Center. Cain signed on for the one week trip and stayed for three months.

Once in Haiti, Cain was introduced to Theresa Patterson who administered the Visitation Hospital

in Ti Riviere, a town of about 20,000 that had been ravished by Hurricane Matthew in October 2016. The modern facility is a clinic built by the Twin Parish Program in Nashville, Tennessee. The resident Haitian staff is augmented by visiting medical teams. Cain set to work clearing up the mess left by the hurricane in a storage facility and building new shelving.

"Nothing is easy in Haiti," he said. Just finding a working truck and driver to haul supplies was a challenge in a country where nearly everyone is so poor they rely on improvisation and cooperation, and where a corrupt government bureaucracy delivers roadblocks instead of services.

During his stay, Cain traveled on a steep, nearly impassable road to visit the mountain community of Lopino still recovering from the hurricane. He also learned to speak some Creole and made friends with people who teach English at the St. Peter's Youth Center. The students there are mainly young adults looking for a better future.

Coley Gorham's mission in founding the school was to train and educate leaders, but it is hard to envision a future in country with few resources

# Convenience Stores Replace General Stores

After 107 years in the Little Falls area of Gorham, the Sawyer family closed their general store last January. For much of the 20th century Sawyer's Variety was one of several small business clustered near the bridge where the Gray Road (202) crosses the Presumpscot River into Windham.

Like Sawyer's, Nicely's Market in northwest Gorham was a business owned by generations of one family. When it closed in 2015, Brenda Nicely reminisced that it had been "a place where neighbors gathered, especially in the morning."

In the 1980s after Maine laws permitted supermarkets to be open on Sundays, small general stores, already losing customers, lost even more. By then too, Gorham people living outside the Village were willing and able to drive longer distances for their groceries. And when new equipment enabled people to pump their own gas, convenience stores with self-service gas pumps located on major thoroughfares signaled the end for most locally-owned groceries and gas stations. Today Americans buy 80% of their fuel at company-owned convenience stores and most of their groceries at supermarkets.

The managers of some Gorham convenience stores are trying to provide the services 21st century shoppers want, while also striving for the atmosphere of a general store. A half mile west of the closed Sawyer's store at the roundabout at routes 202 and 237, is one of two Gorham Lil' Marts owned by the Nouri Corporation. The other is on route 25, a half mile south of the former Nicely's site. Along with the "grab and go" customers who come for gas, lottery tickets, cigarettes and cold drinks, the roundabout store has a regular clientele for morning coffee and serves local workers who buy store-made pizza and sandwiches at lunchtime. "We want to be a neighborhood store," said assistant manager Maryann Peavey.

Further down busy route 25 on Lower Main Street, TNT Quickstop is owned by a Scarborough businessman, but run by a manager known to locals as "Cookie." He is busy with the recent reopening of the convenience store, gas pumps, and car wash bays which were destroyed by a fire in May 2016.

Although he is stocking the usual convenience store products and services, including take-out chicken and an enlarged "beer cave," he too wants to be more than an impersonal quick stop. "Traffic drives customers," he says, but he feels "most excited about seeing all the faces" of his old regular customers back again.

# Elegant Summer Meal

Fire up the grill and enjoy delicious and healthy salmon, elegant wild rice salad and carrots with chimichurri.

### Grilled Salmon

4 salmon steaks  
Blackened Spice Rub (I use Paul Prudhomme's Blackened Redfish Magic)

Pat fish steaks dry with paper towel, rub each with the Spice rub (be liberal!). Grill steaks to your liking...a super easy dish.

### Elegant Wild Rice Salad (10-12 servings)

3 cups wild rice  
(make as directed on package - I use the Near East brand)  
2 6-oz jars marinated artichoke hearts  
1 10-oz package of frozen peas  
1 green bell pepper, chopped  
1 bunch green onions, chopped  
1 pint cherry tomatoes, halved  
Toasted slivered almonds

Dash of: salt, pepper, paprika, cayenne, coriander, cumin.  
1 Tablespoon Italian seasoning  
1 Tablespoon Sriracha  
1 Tablespoon Dijon mustard  
1 teaspoon Worcestershire  
½ cup quinoa  
(I prefer uncooked as it will absorb juices from the veggies)

### Dressing:

1 ½ c vegetable oil	1 teaspoon celery salt
½ c white vinegar	½ teaspoon ground white pepper
½ c freshly grated Parmesan	½ teaspoon dry mustard
1 tablespoon sugar	½ teaspoon paprika
2 teaspoons salt	1 clove garlic, minced

Combine all dressing ingredients in a jar, shake and refrigerate until ready to use. Place cooked rice in a bowl, drain artichoke hearts, reserving marinade. Chop artichoke hearts and add to rice with peas, green pepper, green onions, tomatoes, reserve marinade and half of dressing. Toss well. Cover and chill. Just before serving, toss again; add some of remaining dressing (to taste) if desired. Sprinkle with toasted almonds.

### Roasted Carrots with Chimichurri

Small carrots w/green tops-(multi colored is fun, try to make them generally same size)  
½ c fresh flat leaf parsley, chopped  
½ c fresh cilantro, chopped  
¼ c minced chives  
4 minced garlic cloves  
¼ c Extra Virgin Olive Oil (plus drizzle for baking pan)  
2 tablespoons red wine vinegar  
Salt & pepper

Clean carrots, leave 1-2 inches of tops, chop remaining leafy tops to add to other ingredients for chimichurri. Drizzle carrots with olive oil, salt and pepper and wrap in aluminum foil. Put carrots on a medium grill until fork tender. (15 min. or so depending on your grill and whether you like them well-done or still a little crunchy). You may want to un-wrap and put them directly on the grill for added color for a few minutes at the end. Stir together remaining ingredients. Place carrots on a platter and spoon chimichurri on the carrots, serve remaining alongside.

# Residential and Commercial Growth Continue to Increase

This past fiscal year (July 1, 2016-July 1, 2017), the Planning Board approved 31 out of 34 applications for new developments and amendments to previously approved projects. Two projects were not pursued by applicants, 18 projects had been carried over from 2016 and 19 were carried forward for completion in 2018.

Nine new subdivisions were created with 82 dwelling units and 17 condominium units. Also approved were 42 mixed use development lots, five new private ways, five new public streets and five new potential public roads (pending approval by the Town Council). # Balancing Residential Growth

Gorham schools are considered to be near or at capacity with approximately 2,700 students attending the five schools. Some residents have suggested not permitting any additional residential growth as a means of limiting the number of new students entering the schools. Currently, if a developer wants to build new homes and meets the current rules set by the Town, which are found in the Land Use Code, the Planning Board must approve the development.

The Town can not deny approval based on a desire to potentially limit the number of students coming into the schools. Some communities have limited the number of residential building permits issued annually but this has led to other problems such as commercial builders obtaining most of the permits for new homes before an individual property owner, who might like to build a single home for a family member, is able to obtain a permit thereby shutting them out for the year.

Gorham is constantly amending its ordinances in response to the growth in the community but Town

Manager David Cole pointed out that people with private property have rights to develop their land, and ordinances can be challenged if they are unreasonable.  
Over the years, as Gorham has grown, impact fees have been added for new infrastructure to cover such things as the cost of schools and athletic fields, with new property owners being charged those fees. The Town Council voted to eliminate the impact fees on the debt service for the Middle School but retained other impact fees.  
The Town Council could approve a six-month moratorium on something specific that current ordinances do not address but the goal cannot be to stop housing from being built. For example, the Council could issue a six-month moratorium on the basis of standards that new roads were not adequate to develop better standards for those new roads, and the moratorium could potentially be extended for another six months if specific legal conditions were met. Such a moratorium might well face a court challenge. Cole said that Gorham's current Land Use Code, may not be perfect, but it is very good.

# South Street Project Approved By Voters Slated for 2018

On June 13, Gorham voters approved a referendum item that authorized the borrowing and spending of up to \$500,000 as the Town's share of a road project on South Street.  
The project itself is a 1 1/4" paving overlay from the Gorham Bypass, the roundabout connecting Route 114 and Route 112, to Main Street, a distance of around 2 miles. Some of the road base may be repaired if needed and some sections of the shoulder widened where necessary. The traffic signal loop detector will also be replaced.  
The total cost estimate from MDOT (Maine Department of

Transportation) is \$1,628,148. The Town's local share would be \$407,037. The work is expected to take place during the construction season of 2018 according to Robert Betz from MDOT. Town Manager David Cole said that most MDOT projects have been exceeding their estimates (which is the reason the Main Street project was delayed) so it is possible this time frame may change.  
Cole has recommended to the Town Council and they have agreed to self-fund the project because of the cost of borrowing funds and the chance of a delay in the project. The Town will save between \$40,000 to \$50,000 by not borrowing the money.

and a non-functioning government. Although living where "everything is difficult" eventually wore on Cain, he is eager to return next winter if Patterson can find work for him at the clinic. This time he will stay for two months. His wife, who herself has done mission work, is very supportive, but it is a long time away from home.  
"With all the need—everywhere you look in Haiti—it was nice to do something tangible for a clinic that does so much for the people," Cain said. "It was a treat to stay a while and get to know professional people and towns-

people as well. They are a very strong and cheerful people amid unending hardships."  
The cell phone project is one way Cain is maintaining those relationships. He is hoping people will donate touchscreen phones for him to send to Visitation Hospital. (Flip phones are not useful since most cannot be unlocked). Donors can clear their old phones by selecting "factory reset" and following instructions. # Shaw Park Stewards Vicki and Danny Waite

If you’ve been to Gorham’s Shaw Park since May 1, there’s a good chance you’ve seen or even chatted with Danny or Vicki Waite, the new stewards in their first season at the park. You certainly won’t miss the fifth wheel cozied up to the inside of the fence near the gate.

According to Cindy Hazelton, Gorham Rec. Director, the seasonal steward notion was considered soon after the 7.5 acre park was gifted to the Town of Gorham by Shaw Brothers Construction in December 2005. The park opened in summer of 2006, and for the last nine years, Al and Doris Buzzell held the steward role. For several reasons, they chose to no longer make the trip from Florida each summer.

Vicki and Danny (a retiree after 30 years as a third generation paper mill worker) live in Canton, Maine, and often visit their son Matt, his wife Mallarie, and preschool-aged grandson Camden (“Cam”), who live in Windham just across the town line. Vicki would often walk with Cam along the trails and the couple were familiar with the park. It was during one of those walks early last spring that she noticed the posted “Park Stewards Wanted” ad. The proximity to family, their love of the outdoors, and the beauty of the park led to their enthusiastic application.

The stewards are required to provide their own housing, but receive utilities hook-up from the town. Hazelton said the rec department seeks folks willing to commit from May 1 through Columbus Day weekend, but depart no earlier than Labor Day. The duties have some flexibility, but require assuring the gate is open and locked in sync with the park’s 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. hours.

The Waites take care of kayak, canoe and paddleboard rentals which can be reserved by leaving a message at the park steward number (207-671-1926). In addition to the above rentals, the park has picnic

tables and a small beach area adjoining the canoe and kayak launch, which may be used by anyone during park hours.

Vicki said, “We absolutely want to take the same pride and care in our residence here and through this piece of land like we take care of our own house.” She added, “We’re about family. One of my favorite things about the park is hearing kids laughing.” Danny spoke about his love of seeing parents connecting with their kids, especially in the outdoors. It reminded him of their three sons. “So precious, parents spending time with their kids. Goes by so fast,” he said.

The Waites reiterated several times that Hazelton and others at the recreation department have been very welcoming and helpful. They also tout the Gorham Police Department, whom Vicki said are “awesome,” and Danny added, “They’ve got our back.”

The couple are a friendly presence, but they’ll not be shy to point out that there’s no smoking and no alcohol permitted in the park. While they are attentive to keeping the park trash free, they also noticed early on that the long-time carry-in, carry-out protocol might need improvement. They requested trash cans, which the town has placed near the boat launch. Another addition this year is a mat on the launch, making for easier and less damaging kayak and canoe dragging. Both the park and the Waites are eager for your visit.

# Middle Schoolers are Fighting the Knotweed

COLLABORATION OF GMS STUDENTS  
IN MRS. GOSPODAREK’S SEVENTH  
GRADE CLASSES

There is something big invading Gorham, but few know about it. This past year, Mrs. Gospodarek’s seventh grade science classes worked outside to kill an invasive species that has taken over the wooded area around Gorham Middle School (GMS).

Students worked in groups of three to try to come up with their own ideas to get rid of Fallopia Japonica, also known as Japanese Knotweed. This is a fast growing invasive species that looks just like bamboo. It has small red/green leaves. Japanese Knotweed was introduced into the U.S. from Eastern Asia, Japan, and China in the 1800s.

An invasive species is any kind of living organism that is not native to a certain location. It harms the environment and other living organisms. Invasive species grow, reproduce, and spread fast. Invasive species can cause serious harm to the ecosystem that it is in.

When an invasive species is introduced into an ecosystem, it might not have any predators. Also, it can breed and spread quickly, which means that it will take over an area. Invasive species eat native species, and the food that they eat, so they out-compete native species. Japanese Knotweed needs controlling because it can take over an area very quickly as it spreads aggressively and kill native species that other species need to survive.

To try to kill the Knotweed, students came up with ideas such as sprays (using a variety of different ingredients from coffee to vinegar to lime juice to dish soap), or digging it up and planting something else, and putting tarps on their area. They were not allowed to use any

chemicals or herbicides. In order to test their theories they worked in an area in the woods behind the middle school where many people walk/run/bike. Additionally, there is a pond near the school where these students experimented.

To experiment with their ideas, students were given a 10x10 foot plot. Once or twice a week students went outside to work on their plot, as well as collect data. In the classroom, they used the data to make their own website. They also put their data on the website “Vital Signs,” which is a Gulf of Maine Research Institute Program.

A district forester for the state of Maine came in to teach and speak to the classes about all the different invasive species that are growing in Maine and other places. Mrs. Gospodarek and her incoming classes are going to continue to try to eliminate the knotweed and learn more about the other invasive species that have taken over the woods behind GMS.

# GMS Junior Solar Sprint Challenge

For the third year running, the majority of eighth graders at Gorham Middle School (GMS) participated in the Junior Solar Sprint (JSS) Challenge on May 30 at GMS. In the past, the JSS was sponsored through the Maine Energy Education Program. This year, the ownership was passed to Sacopee Energy and Climate Activities as one of their STEM program offerings.

Students worked in teams in their science classes for a few weeks to design, build, and make continuous improvements to their solar cars. They selected materials, worked with tools, and tried to problem solve when their cars veered off in the wrong direction. Many students created custom parts using 3-D printing technology. Race day arrived with a bit of lingering rain and wet surfaces, so the Solar Sprint became a Mock Solar Sprint in the gym, with battery-powered solar panel replicas in place of the real panels.

Each science class held qualifying races to ferret out the top competitors. Some crowd favorites were the car that lost a wheel but finished anyway and the races that were classic tortoise and hare, where one car would start strong but falter and a slower but steadier car would nip it near the end. Some cars that worked well in practice would struggle in the race, and others that seemed doomed to stay stuck in the gate surprised everyone and finished strongly.

At the end of the day a championship heat was held, and then 15 of the top cars were invited to the State Championship held at the Paris Elementary School in South Paris on

June 3. Of the 15 students invited, two were able to find room in their busy weekend schedules to head to the competition.

Riley Johnson and Madisun Tryon both raced their cars at the competition. Both cars performed well. Johnson’s car won a sprint and made it to the semi-finals. Tryon’s car was the runner-up in one of her heats. In addition, Johnson’s original car design captured two first place awards in the categories of Innovation and Technological Merit.

The students at GMS did a fantastic job and a big thank you to all of the community support they received. Much of the equipment was purchased through grants received from the Gorham Educational Foundation, Berlin City Drive for Education, and the Perloff Foundation. There were also several parent volunteers who helped coordinate logistics for the day, for which everyone was extremely grateful.

## **Conservation Committee Making Great Strides to Expand Trails**

In addition to maintaining and improving its system of trails in Gorham which include Claire Drew Trail, High School to Weeks Road parcel and Tannery Brook Preserve, the Gorham Conservation Commission (GCC) has exciting plans for two major expansions which will greatly increase public access to trails in Gorham.

According to GCC Chairman, Rob Lavoie, work is underway to obtain permits in order to build a multi-use trail that will connect Tannery Brook Preserve and the Pheasant Knoll community to the village center. This trail will begin at the new subdivision being built off Glenwood Drive (off Water Street) and located behind the Burger King Plaza, and will connect to existing Tannery Brook trails. They hope to break ground some time next year. Lavoie said, "This is a significant and costly project as it involves building a 300 foot boardwalk over a marsh. It will also give our residents beautiful views of the Tannery Brook wetlands and the wildlife that inhabits it."

GCC is also working toward making the "Crosstown Trail" a reality. Much of the trail will sit on the old railroad bed that runs east/west through town. According to Lavoie, "Our vision is to create a continuous trail from the Middle School heading north towards the High School and continuing east all the way to the Industrial Park, connecting existing

neighborhoods along the way." This project involves reaching out to key landowners to ask for trail easements. These parcel easements will allow GCC to connect missing links along the corridor. From the Industrial Park, they plan to continue the trail to connect with Westbrook and also provide a spur heading over towards Beals Ice Cream.

Claire Drew trail, located behind Narragansett school and the Public Safety buildings, got a major makeover with trail resurfacing and cutting back of overgrowth. Thanks to hard-working volunteers like Justin Verrill of V&M Construction, the smoother surface will make it easier to push a stroller on this trail. Tannery Brook has been mowed and a rotted bridge at the end of Weeks Road has been replaced thanks to the generosity of Jon Smith and his family.

Another big improvement are the trail maps that can now be found at the trailhead kiosks at Claire Drew and Tannery Brook Preserve. The new Weeks Road map will be available as soon as the kiosk at the trailhead behind the middle school is installed. Volunteer John Sturm and committee member, Bill Moreno, worked hard to make these maps available.




